Haines Gallery proudly presents *Wildwood*, an exhibition by the acclaimed UK artist David Nash. For over fifty years, Nash has developed a body of work that includes sculptures, installations, and works on paper, each exploring the nature of place and our relationship to the larger landscape.

Wildwood includes a selection of standing and wall-hung sculptures of carved and charred wood, created from fallen beech, oak, and redwood trees. Working with industrial tools such as the chainsaw, ax, and blowtorch, Nash teases out the inherent form and behavior of unseasoned wood, allowing its natural qualities to inform the final shape of his works. At the center of the exhibition is *Three Red Sheaves* (2013), an elegant sculpture comprising three slender redwood columns, measuring over nine feet tall and each created from a single piece of wood, which the artist has masterfully carved into an accordion fold of peaks. The work at once recalls organ pipes, the fluted columns of Classical architecture, and towering redwood trunks, while invoking the awe-inspiring experience of standing before such ancient growth.

Nash's sculptures are complemented by *Five Charred Sculptures* (2009), a work on paper that references signature shapes that appear throughout his practice—mounds, columns, totems, pyramids—while highlighting his use of fire as both an aesthetic tool and as symbol of metamorphosis. Fire destroys, but in nature, it can also create the necessary conditions for growth and regeneration.

Within an intimate exhibition space, *Wildwood* provides an opportunity for viewers to contemplate natural forms and phenomena, and reminds us of the beauty and elegance found in the outdoor environment.

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

British, b. 1945 Lives and works in Wales

For over fifty years, David Nash has produced sculptures and related works explore the nature of place and our relationship with the larger landscape. He is known primarily for his sculptures of carved and charred wood, often using every part of fallen trees, or cast in bronze; as well as monumental installations of wood, bronze, and even live trees, which are coaxed and redirected into living, growing sculptures. In his charcoal drawings and works on paper, the recurring motifs in Nash's practice—the pyramid, sphere, column, and square—are reproduced as elegantly reduced forms.

In addition to a recent major career retrospective at the National Museum Cardiff, Wales and the Towner Art Gallery, Eastbourne, England (both 2019-2020), Nash has been the subject of major exhibitions at the Kunsthalle Mannheim, Germany (2009); Yorkshire Sculpture Park, UK (2023, 2010); Kew Gardens, London, UK (2013); Frederik Meijer Gardens & Sculpture Park, Grand Rapids, MI (2014); The Royal Academy, London, UK (2015); Tremenheere Sculpture Gardens, Penzance, UK (2017); and Museum Lothar Fischer, Neumarkt in der Oberpflaz, Germany (2018). His work is held in the collections of leading international institutions including: Guggenheim Museum, New York, NY; Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, NY; de Young Museum, San Francisco, CA; Museum of Contemporary Art, Los Angeles, CA; Uffizi Gallery, Florence, Italy; Museum of Contemporary Art, Tokyo, Japan; Tate Modern, London, UK; Victoria and Albert Museum, London, UK; and Yorkshire Sculpture Park, UK. In 2004, Nash was awarded an Order of the British Empire for Services for Arts.


