### DAVID MAISEL

### Un/Earthed

Haines Gallery proudly presents **David Maisel:** *Un/Earthed*, our eighth solo exhibition with the Bay Area artist. For over thirty years, Maisel has created powerful photographs of sites transformed by human intervention. At once mesmerizing and disquieting, his thoughtfully composed aerial images consider the aesthetics, politics, and environmental impact of these radically altered landscapes.

Un/Earthed brings together a survey of Maisel's aerial works from various series created between 1989 and 2018. The Mining Project (1989), The Lake Project (2001-15), and Terminal Mirage (2003-05) chronicle the effects of mining, industrial pollution, water diversion projects, and desertification across the American West, from open pit mines in Arizona and Montana to the depletion of Owens Lake in California and Utah's Great Salt Lake. The Fall (2013) depicts zones of industry and agriculture in Spain, while his most recent series, Desolation Desert (2018), created with support from a Guggenheim Foundation Fellowship, focuses on the massive copper and lithium mining operations in Chile's Atacama Desert. This sensitive eco-region is being transformed at an unparalleled pace and scale, reflecting a shift in the burden of energy production onto landscapes in the southern hemisphere.

In Maisel's images, we find a strange, discomfiting beauty born of environmental degradation. Giving detailed but open-ended information, Maisel's works operate on a metaphorical level as much as a documentary one. Lush, saturated colors belie sites of ecological damage: painterly washes of industrial waste and toxic algae blooms, the jewel-toned grids of lithium evaporation ponds. Graphic marks emerge from manmade trauma on land that has been carved, scarred, and drained.

The exhibition's title, *Un/Earthed*, suggests both the extractive industries behind these changes as well as the process of discovery made possible through Maisel's photographs. Witnessed from an aerial perspective, the landscape is abstracted and disorienting, a reflection of the physical transformations brought about by human efforts. The terrain here is an alien one, the Earth made unearthly by our own presence.

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### DAVID MAISEL



American, b. 1961 Lives and works in San Francisco, California

David Maisel's photographs chronicle the complex relationships between natural systems and human intervention, often focusing on the physical transformation of the landscape caused by industrial efforts. Maisel's aerial images of sites around the world initially appear abstract and painterly—offering detailed but open-ended visual information that operates as both documentary and metaphor, seducing viewers with a strange beauty that critics have dubbed "the apocalyptic sublime."

Maisel's photographs, multi-media projects, and public insetallations have recently been exhibited at the National Gallery of Art, Washington, D.C; Museum of Photographic Arts, San Diego, CA; San Jose Museum of Art, CA; Berkeley Art Museum and Pacific Film Archive, CA; Cantor Center for Visual Arts at Stanford University, CA; Denver Art Museum, CO; Nevada Art Museum, Reno, NV; Ullens Center for Contemporary Art, Beijing, China; ZKM Center for Art and Media, Karlsruhe, Germany; National Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art, Seoul, South Korea; and National Gallery of Victoria, Melbourne, Australia. His works are included in many public collections, including the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, CA; Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, NY; Los Angeles County Museum of Art, CA; J. Paul Getty Museum, Los Angeles, CA; National Gallery of Art, Washington, D.C; Victoria and Albert Museum, London, UK; George Eastman Museum, Rochester, NY; Minneapolis Institute of Arts, MN; Yale University Art Gallery, New Haven, CT; and Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, TX.

Maisel was a Scholar in Residence at the Getty Research Institute, and Artist in Residence at the Headlands Center for the Arts. He received a Guggenheim Fellowship in 2018, as well as an Individual Artist's Grant from the National Endowment for the Arts (1990) and Investing in Artists Grant from the Center for Cultural Innovation (2011). His work has been the subject of seven monographs: The Lake Project (Nazraeli Press, 2004), Oblivion (Nazraeli Press, 2006), Library of Dust (Chronicle Books, 2008), History's Shadow (Nazraeli Press, 2011), Black Maps (Steidl, 2013), Mount St Helens: Afterlife (Ivorypress, 2018), and Proving Ground (Radius Books and the Nora Eccles Harrison Museum of Art/ Utah State University, 2020).
